Way down in Bethlehem.

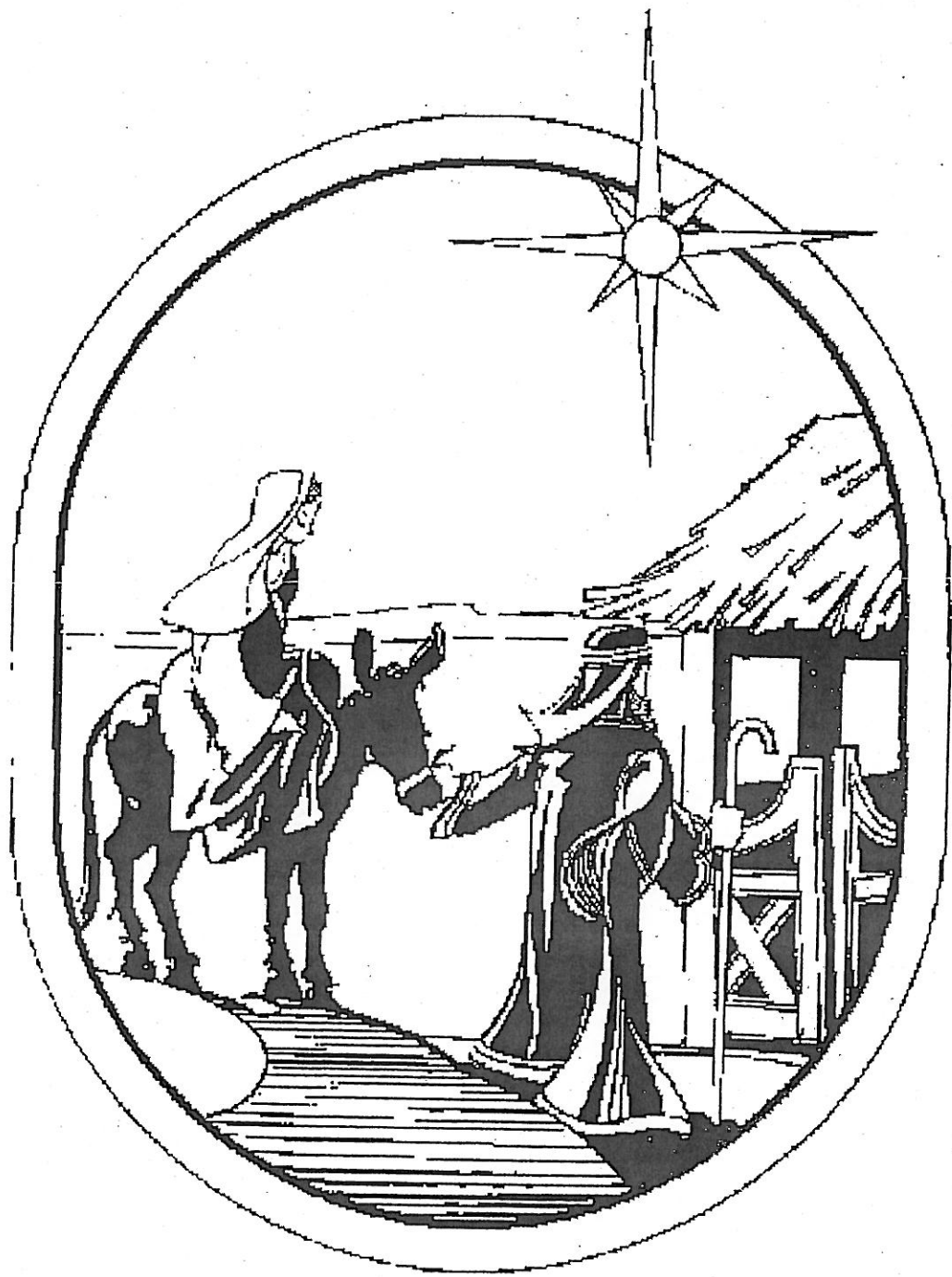

Recipes

Grandmother's Famous Cranberry Bread

Sift: 2 cups flour
1 cup sugar
1 ½ t. baking powder
1 t. salt

Cut in: ¼ c. margarine

Add: 1 egg
1 t. grated orange peel
¾ c. orange juice

Fold in: 1½ cup chopped cranberries

Bake: 350 for 15 minutes in greased muffin tins

Christmas Sugar Cookie Recipe

Set the oven at 375 degrees

Cream until light and fluffy:

½ cup butter

Beat in

¾ cup sugar

Add

1 egg or 2 egg yolks

½ tsp. vanilla

Beat thoroughly. Add

1 tablespoon cream or milk

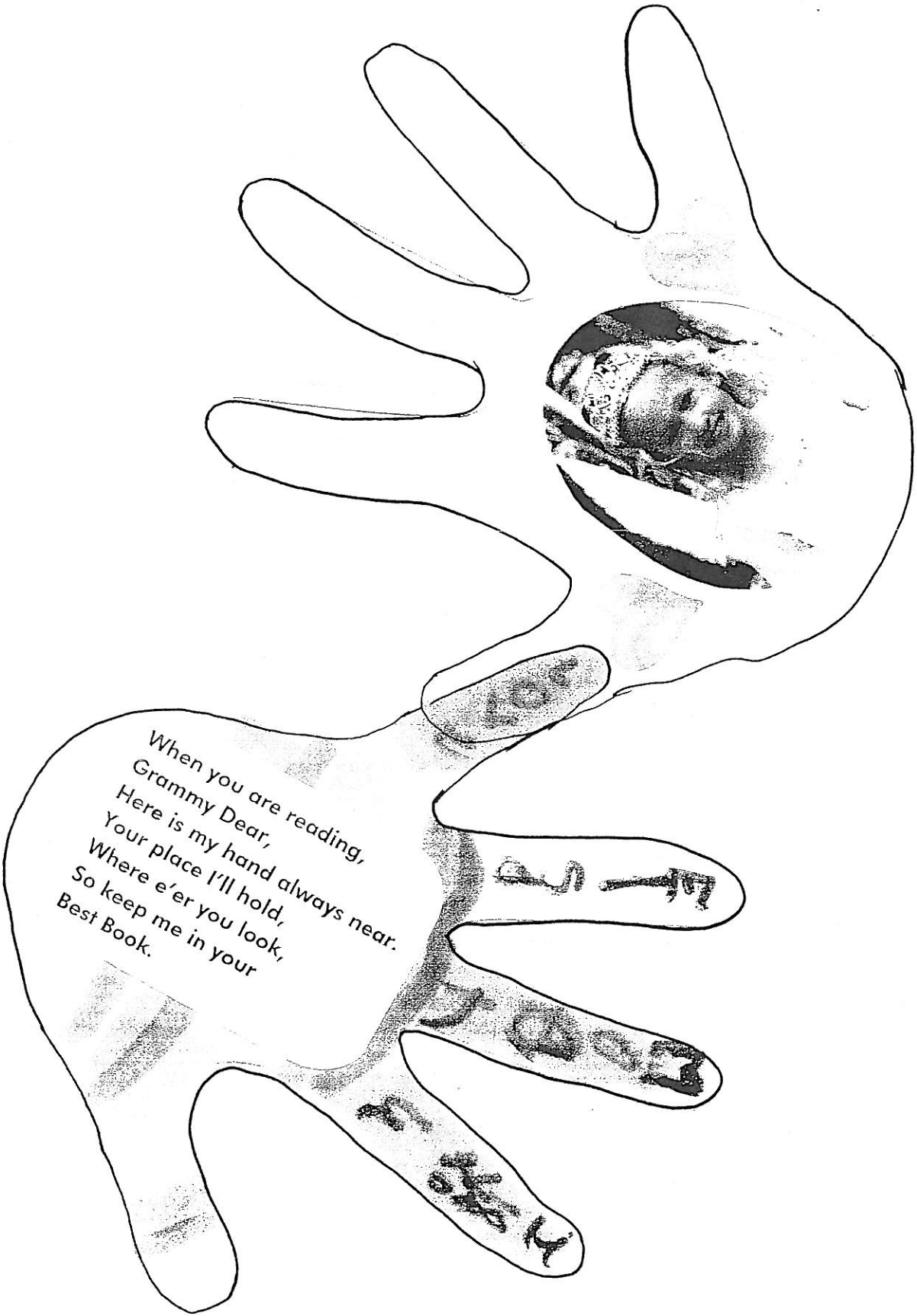
Sift together

1 ½ cup flour

¼ tsp. salt

¼ tsp. Baking powder

Stir into the butter mixture and blend well. Chill 1 hour or more. Roll ¼ inch thick and cut out. (I double the recipe).

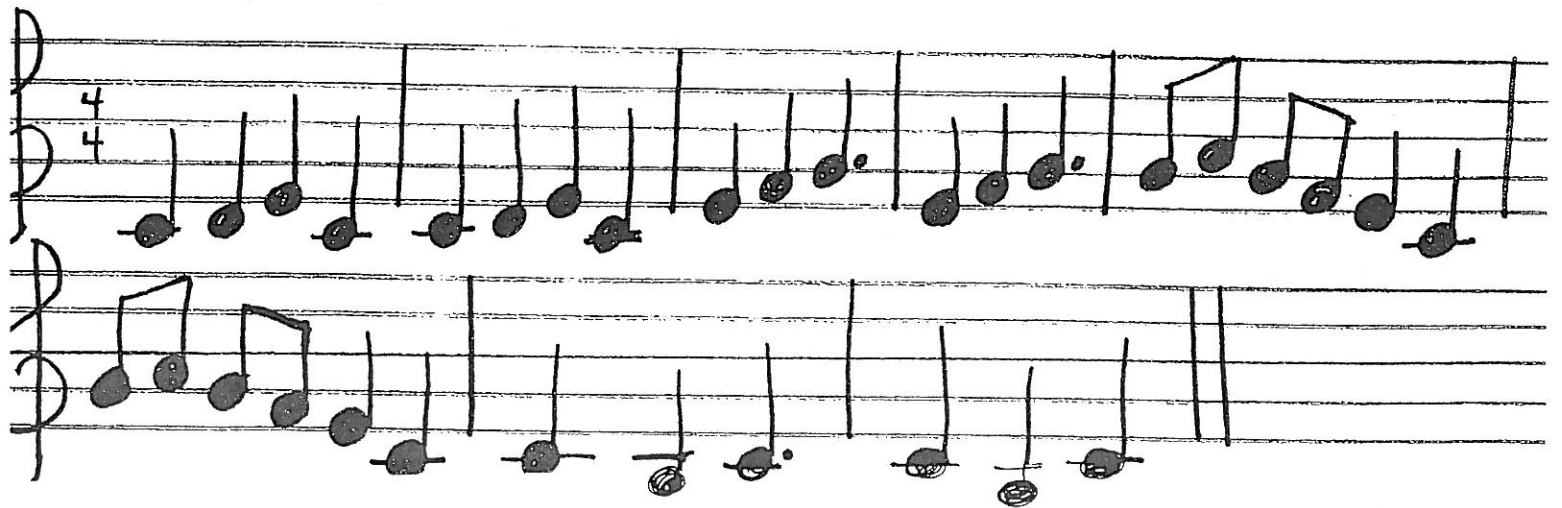

About 1 ½ cups water

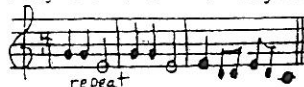
Mix well...Children create mini babies...
